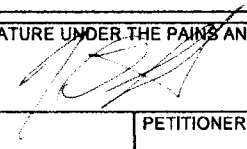
**PETITION FOR COMMITMENT
FOR ALCOHOL OR SUBSTANCE USE DISORDER**
G.L. c. 123, § 35

The undersigned Petitioner hereby applies to this court for an order committing the Respondent named above for inpatient care and treatment for an alcohol or substance use disorder for a period not to exceed 90 days under the provisions of G.L. c. 123, § 35.

The Petitioner has reason to believe that the Respondent has an alcohol or substance use disorder, and petitions the court to find there is a likelihood of serious harm as a result of the Respondent's chronically or habitually consuming or ingesting alcoholic beverages and/or controlled substances or intentionally inhaling toxic vapors to the extent that such use substantially injures the respondent's health or substantially interferes with the Respondent's social or economic functioning, or that the Respondent has lost the power of self-control over the use of such beverages and/or substances.

Reasons Respondent may not appear before the Court if summonsed, and reasons Respondent is in immediate danger:

is a 47 y/o male with substance use disorder combined with untreated psychiatric disorders and while under the influence of drugs loses control of his mind and body causing a danger to himself and others - please see attachments

EXCERPTS FROM G.L. c. 123, §§ 1 and 35

G.L. c. 123, § 1. Definitions. "Likelihood of serious harm", (1) a substantial risk of physical harm to the person himself as manifested by evidence of, threats of, or attempts at, suicide or serious bodily harm; (2) a substantial risk of physical harm to other persons as manifested by evidence of homicidal or other violent behavior or evidence that others are placed in reasonable fear of violent behavior and serious physical harm to them; or (3) a very substantial risk of physical impairment or injury to the person himself as manifested by evidence that such person's judgment is so affected that he is unable to protect himself in the community and that reasonable provision for his protection is not available in the community."

G.L. c. 123, § 35. Commitment for alcohol or substance use disorder. "Alcohol use disorder", the chronic or habitual consumption of alcoholic beverages by a person to the extent that (1) such use substantially injures the person's health or substantially interferes with the person's social or economic functioning, or (2) the person has lost the power of self-control over the use of such beverages."

"Substance use disorder", the chronic or habitual consumption or ingestion of controlled substances or intentional inhalation of toxic vapors by a person to the extent that: (i) such use substantially injures the person's health or substantially interferes with the person's social or economic functioning; or (ii) the person has lost the power of self-control over the use of such controlled substances or toxic vapors."

"Any police officer, physician, spouse, blood relative, guardian or court official may petition in writing any district court . . . for an order of commitment of a person whom he has reason to believe has an alcohol or substance use disorder. . . . [T]he court shall immediately schedule a hearing on the petition and shall cause a summons and a copy of the application to be served upon the person . . . [I]f there are reasonable grounds to believe that such person will not appear and that any further delay in the proceedings would present an immediate danger to the physical well-being of the respondent, said court may issue a warrant for the apprehension and appearance of such person before it. If such person is not immediately presented before a judge of the district court, the warrant shall continue day after day for up to 5 consecutive days, excluding Saturdays, Sundays and legal holidays, or until such time as the person is presented to the court, whichever is sooner; provided, however that an arrest on such warrant shall not be made unless the person may be presented immediately before a judge of the district court. . . . The court shall order examination by a qualified physician, a qualified psychologist or a qualified social worker."

"If, after a hearing which shall include expert testimony and may include other evidence, the court finds that such person is an individual with an alcohol or substance use disorder and there is a likelihood of serious harm as a result of the person's alcohol or substance use disorder, the court may order such person to be committed for a period not to exceed 90 days to a facility designated by the department of public health, followed by the availability of case management services provided by the department of public health for up to 1 year; provided, that a review of the necessity of the commitment shall take place by the superintendent on days 30, 45, 60 and 75 as long as the commitment continues. A person so committed may be released prior to the expiration of the period of commitment upon written determination by the superintendent of the facility that release of that person will not result in a likelihood of serious harm. Such commitment shall be for the purpose of inpatient care for the treatment of an alcohol or substance use disorder in a facility licensed or approved by the department of public health or the department of mental health. Subsequent to the issuance of a commitment order, the superintendent of a facility may authorize the transfer of a patient to a different facility for continuing treatment. . . ."

"If the department of public health informs the court that there are no suitable facilities available for treatment licensed or approved by the department of public health or the department of mental health, or if the court makes a specific finding that the only appropriate setting for treatment for the person is a secure facility, then the person may be committed to: (i) a secure facility for women approved by the department of public health or the department of mental health, if a female; or (ii) the Massachusetts correctional institution at Bridgewater, if a male; provided, however, that any person so committed shall be housed and treated separately from persons currently serving a criminal sentence. The person shall, upon release, be encouraged to consent to further treatment and shall be allowed voluntarily to remain in the facility for such purpose."

To whom it may concern:

My name is Joshua DeLisle and I am a Police Officer with the Boston Police Department's Street Outreach Unit.

I am submitting the attached Section 35 for [REDACTED] after knowing [REDACTED] for approximately two years. I became acquainted with [REDACTED] while working patrol in the Southampton Street area. [REDACTED], a homeless drug addicted [REDACTED] male, is known by many officers and the source of at least 3 to 5 calls for service per day. When sober, [REDACTED] is a gentleman with goals and aspirations of a successful future, however while under the influence of drugs, [REDACTED] loses control of himself mentally and physically and is often seen jumping around uncontrollably, fighting with inanimate objects, yelling, arguing with himself, screaming, and running into traffic without regard to safety. It is because of this, [REDACTED] is the source of numerous calls for emergency services.

[REDACTED] is also bi-polar, schizophrenic, and depressed. These psychiatric illnesses are exaggerated immensely when [REDACTED] is under the influence of drugs. From conversations with [REDACTED], I am aware that he has not taken any medications to help with these psychiatric disorders in many years.

In the time that I have known [REDACTED], I have always offered him opportunities to be admitted into detox and begin some type of recovery. In my opinion, a section 35 is a very important tool that should not be misused. I tend to only submit section 35's on individuals that are in extreme danger to themselves or others and until now have not completed one in [REDACTED].

Two weeks ago, [REDACTED] accepted my offer for detox with the stipulation he would meet me the next morning. To be quite honest, I was surprised and didn't think he would show up. The next day at 7:00 am while parked in front of the Southampton Street shelter [REDACTED] walked up and hopped into my cruiser and said "let's go". [REDACTED] was subsequently admitted to the [REDACTED]. In the "sober conversation" we had while enroute to detox, [REDACTED] explained his mental illness, the lack of medication, and drug use and the life journey that brought him to this point in time.

[REDACTED] graduated from detox approximately 5 days afterward. The staff at the [REDACTED] said [REDACTED] was an absolute gentleman and "did great." Unfortunately, [REDACTED] was not placed into a facility for continued treatment.

In the last 8 days or so, [REDACTED] has been on a spree of reckless drug use. Yesterday, I was told by a brother officer that [REDACTED] was trying to get a hold of me and it was then I went to the Southampton Street area to find [REDACTED]. I encountered [REDACTED] near Theo Glynn Way and spoke with him for over an hour. The report I received from locals that know [REDACTED] was that he had "a tough morning" but in our current conversation he was holding it together. We spoke for approximately an hour and [REDACTED] decided it was time to go, with the promise he would try detox again soon. Within the hour, calls began coming in for a person out of control in the area of South Bay Mall for a person fitting [REDACTED] description. Numerous units were dispatched and we encountered [REDACTED] near the entrance to the mall. In my opinion, this was one of [REDACTED] worst displays.

██████████ was continuously yelling at himself "██████████ THEY CAN HEAR YOU, STOP ██████████". ██████████ had trouble focusing and was clearly under the influence of drugs. He was moving uncontrollably and quite literally fighting with himself to regain composure, which did not happen.

Knowing ██████████ history of mental illness I relayed to EMT's that I would be Section 12-ing ██████████. ██████████ reluctantly walked to the ambulance and once inside lost control of himself again. With clenched fists and refusals to sit down, ██████████ argued with himself, me, and EMTs that he was leaving, to which we relayed he was not. ██████████ tried to get up and leave and at this point I raised my voice to ██████████ and yelled he you're not going fucking anywhere and to sit the fuck down and stop being an asshole. This is what it took to change his focus and loss of mental control, he laid in the gurney and apologized. His arms were still moving around uncontrollably, but his mind was "coming back".

Now at Boston Medical Center, my idea of a treatment plan began. EMT's, the triage nurse, the medical staff, and psychiatry all agreed and.

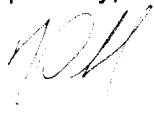
1. Submit the section 12 for a mental eval of ██████████
2. Start ██████████ on meds that will help his mental illness
3. Attempt to "hold" ██████████ overnight
4. Complete and submit a Section 35 on the morning of November 8th
5. Pending approval of the 35, ██████████ would be able to begin court ordered inpatient treatment accompanied with necessary medications

After ██████████ last unmedicated attempt at recovery I realized that he could not tackle the challenge of recovery while his mental illness was still untreated.

After remaining with ██████████ for 4 hours at BMC to supervise the continuity of care and to make sure ██████████ made no attempt to leave, psychiatry agreed to keep ██████████.

With that I ask that mandatory commitment be approved and ██████████ admitted to a program with proper medications so that he may have a chance of recovery. My last knowledge was that ██████████ is still being treated at BMC and will be ready for a court evaluation if granted.

NARRATIVE

On Thursday November 7, 2019 at approximately 2:15 PM while assigned as the YD50 (Street Outreach Unit) and on a code 19 in the area of Southampton Street, a radio call for a person out of control near the Target department store was broadcast on BPD channel 6.

C-6 units responded and quickly located the individual who is well known to officers as [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] was out of control; yelling at himself and trying to control his physical and verbal outbursts. I have personally known [REDACTED] for approximately 2 years and of the many, many interactions I have had with him, both while under the influence and otherwise, todays display was one of his worst that I have seen.

During numerous failed attempts to calm [REDACTED] EMS arrived and [REDACTED] was reluctantly walked into EMS A06. While inside of the ambulance, [REDACTED] argued repeatedly and attempted to leave; it was then I informed EMS I would be filing a Section 12 on him at the hospital with the prior knowledge that [REDACTED] has not been taking his psych meds for quite sometime and as a result has not been able to sustain a successful recovery from opiod use.

NARRATIVE

About 3:08 P.M. on Friday, November 1st, 2019, Officers Herbert and Saintfort assigned to the [REDACTED] responded to a radio call for a disturbance at 27 School St (Starbucks), Boston.

Upon arrival, Officer met with an employee of Starbucks who stated a person has locked themselves inside of the bathroom of the store. The employee further stated the person has been inside of the bathroom for the past hour and continues to scream and bang against things inside of the bathroom. The employee also stated he and other employees have tried numerous times to ask the person to come out of the bathroom to no avail.

At this point officers followed the employee to the bathroom where the unknown party was located. While walking to the bathroom, officers could hear the sound of a male screaming and hitting the wall/door to the bathroom.

Officers did knock and announced their presence as Boston Police Officers. The unknown party did come out of the bathroom in a panic stating to officers "Please help". Officers identified the male as [REDACTED]

Officers observed [REDACTED] to be sweating profusely, eyes dilated, and unable to tell officers what he was doing inside of the bathroom. Officers also observed [REDACTED] to be unable to stand still while officer encountered him. For officer safety and for the safety of civilians inside of Starbucks, officers placed [REDACTED] in handcuff to secure him until EMS arrived on scene.

Officers observed [REDACTED] to be bleeding from his right knuckle area. After securing [REDACTED], officer Herbert observed the bathroom to have blood on the walls, vomit on the floor, trash barrel to be dented, and trash all over the floor where [REDACTED] was found. [REDACTED] continued to scream causing multiple civilians to stop and watch. [REDACTED] stated to officers "the demons keep speaking to me" Officers asked [REDACTED] if he was under the influence of any drugs to which [REDACTED] stated he used K2 (artificial marijuana) earlier on this date [REDACTED].

[REDACTED] arrived on scene and transported [REDACTED] to Mass General Hospital for further medical evaluation.
